Dear Lebanon Friends in Christ,

May the peace of Christ and the love of God be with you. Having said that I feel like I am stepping on Paul's toes like a child dancing on an adult's feet. Maybe, I am, maybe we all are as we make our Christian iourneys through the turmoil around us. Staying centered on Christ is the best way to negotiate today's obstacles. Please be reminded of Paul's words to the Corinthians as he cautioned them to 'be of one mind' and to avoid popular rhetoric and politics that tended to polarize people into divisive camps. And also, remember that in biblical times certain limitations were made on lifestyles to preserve the health of the community of believers.

We begin with good news. While worshipping in masks on the grass, we saw the new gutters and newly painted fascia boards of the church. Thank you Jon for coordinating that project. We lift our praise for the Soup Kitchen as they welcome Christine as supervisor; and also offer our prayers and joy for Pastor Zane and Paul as they make a home together. We thank Kennedy for her wonderful participation at church as she interned. As she will be heading to Fort Worth to begin her college career, we offer our prayers and good wishes on her continued success.

August will be our 5th month living with COVID-19. The expanded executive committee (all church officers and the elder and deacon chairs) will meet outside for the second time this summer. On Thursday at 4 pm, our executive officers will find a shaded spot at Mike and Shervl's place. If you have concerns, needs, or innovative solutions, please call, text, email, or plan to attend. But do notify the church office or board chairs of your information or attendance. We welcome your input.

At this time, items on the agenda include:

- Congregational worship. Technically, we can have church inside with masks and social distancing. So the question is how to continue safely, whether to worship inside without the usual congregational activities like singing, sharing of communion, or passing the plate as we have in the past. Then there is the issue of sanitation (sanctuary and the bathrooms and all switches and handles) and finding a team or person to perform this task. The addition of online or Zoom Bible study, and creating church neighbor groups and/or Zoom groups are other considerations.
- Church finances. Many of you have continued to support the church during the last five months. We praise and thank you and God that we are still able to pay bills, maintenance, and salaries. The committee will look into actual income and expenses to determine if we need to make adjustments for the rest of 2020, and will begin forming a committee to create the 2021 budget. Thank you Doris and Donna for your ongoing work to do banking, pay bills, and provide the financial statements.
- Youth Group. It is a challenge, and a joy. I would think being a youth is especially difficult right now, and having lost the Berryman family the participating youths have declined significantly. We need to discuss the future of youth group. This week, the youth are experiencing 'Camp in a Box' rather than days in a summer youth camp. We send our love and prayers to all youth and particularly the Berryman family. We miss you already.
- Pastor's annual review will finally take place in the next month. We will address the job description, performance, and current appointment at 3/4th time. Another consideration is his one-bedroom apartment (housing pastor and a fifteen year old) and current church budget constraints.
- And then, there is the need to create a slate of officers for 2021 if we are to continue as normal, whatever that may be. The terms of board chair and co-chair, clerk, 1 trustee, 2 elders, and 4 deacons will need to be filled as well as some vacancies.

Any other concerns or input?

Much to be done, many challenges, but God has the answers, and knows who to call. Have you heard him calling in the night? Will you answer with, "Here I am, Lord."
