Happy Easter church family,

There are many sides to Easter, but to get to that Holy Sunday of resurrection, you have to sit in the death and pain of Holy Saturday. We've been doing that for a whole year now, but even on that special day, there is mystery to the unfolding resurrection, there are unprocessed feelings even as we process that special moment. As we celebrate the places that have been resurrected, we must also honor the places that are still dying. As we approach our Easter service, it may not be the exact same joyous event that it always is, but I hope it will be one where both the mystery and the celebration are honored. So wherever you are and however you are feeling, and whether you are worshipping online or in-person with us, bring your whole self to both the mystery and the miracle, the waiting and the resurrection.

Starting at the end of April, I'll be offering a new class on Disciples of Christ Polity and Practice, and the History of the Stone-Campbell movement, in reverse! I'm calling it Backward History, and it will be offered both in-person and over Zoom, on the last Tuesday evening of each month. If you are a life-long Disciple or just wandered into our church in the past few years, there will be a lot to learn about our movement that became a denomination, and how the commitments of the Stone-Campbell movement interact with our personal religious commitments. The first class will

take place on Tuesday, April 27th at 6:00 pm, last about an hour and a half, and primarily be about the Disciples of Christ denomination today, specifically how we can be both ultra-congregational and denominational at the same time!

I wanted to get you up to date on the regional conversation around camp this year. The current thinking is that we will not be able to do traditional overnight camp, but that we won't do virtual events either. The idea is to have "adventure days" where we would meet up with district churches for day trips to do activities, perform some service, and, like camp, hopefully eat good food and sing some songs. There's a meeting in mid-April to plan this further, so I should have more information by next month.

AUDIO/VISUAL IMPROVEMENTS IN NEAR FUTURE!

I've shared many times that we are having conversations about improving our Audio/Visual capacities both for streaming, and for improved sound quality in the Sanctuary. Brinoch LLC from Eugene is working with us to show us the kind of equipment that will allow us to do this. Further, a generous contribution from the Phillips family in honor of their father Rod Phillips has been made to significantly jumpstart our investment for increased audio/visual capacity. The first phase that will soon be going to the board for approval involves upgrading the soundboard, a new camera, and a video switcher that will all greatly improve our streaming capacity, and make for better sound and less stress on Sunday morning. This installation and transition would happen probably mid-summer. It's very exciting, and we're extremely grateful for the legacy gift that allows us to dream these dreams.
